Christian Parenting

Sometimes, as parents, we feel that nothing is getting through to our children. That’s when we pray SOMETHING will stick; that some little Godly nugget of “wisdom” will point them to Christ. If you feel like we do sometimes, don’t lose heart.

Remember, as we have to, that God is using you, as a Christian parent, to impact your precious children’s lives, whether you see it yet or not.

And when you despair (as we sometimes do) look at the little signs that show you some of it is “sticking”. These signs such as when our six year-old says, “Read just one more chapter please!” when we are reading a book about heaven; we look back in the van while on a trip and our two oldest children are doing their devotions; our four year-old sings along with
